Board of Youth


The Board of Youth is looking for multiple volunteers.

I am writing this to you just two days after I received my placement to serve as Campus Pastor at Woodbury Lutheran Church in Woodbury, MN. This is the same church that I did my Vicarage at, and our family could not be more excited to be returning to this awesome ministry where we have so many friends who we cannot wait to reconnect with.

As I reflect upon this journey that the Lord has been leading me on, I am blown away by the amount of people that He has used to shape and mold me into who I am today and the pastor that I am going to be. It was special to have my parents, including my dad who is a pastor as well, right there with me as I follow in his footsteps and enter into the ministry.

My wife, Kali, has been incredible on this journey. The road for a wife of a Seminarian is difficult. You have to delay settling down in one location for another four years. Seminarian wives oftentimes have to provide some of the income for the family, while also taking care of children during the day. Despite the challenging road, Kali has handled it all like a champ, and I am so grateful for the loving spouse that she is to me, as well as how incredible of a mother that she is to our daughter Naomi. While all the semesters here at the seminary have been formative, this Spring Semester has been phenomenal.

I was able to speak with my future supervisor and learned the church we were called to is a younger LCMS congregation and growing fast. Just last year they had 40 new members join their congregation! Grulke Bible Translators in Botswana

The last couple of months have been so full, we forgot to send an update last month! Now, we have twice as much to share! There's been lots of excitement around here.

Kelsey graduated! After years of hard work, Kelsey completed her master's degree in World Arts with an emphasis in Scripture Engagement. This degree will help her encourage people to use the music, poetry, and visual arts that speak to their hearts to engage with the newly translated scriptures.

Kelsey's parents visited us in April. We loved having them around and the help they provided as Kelsey wrapped up her studies. The kids loved having Grandma and Grandpa around. They even got to see the school play. It is so special when the kids get time with their grandparents!

The Shekgalagari New Testament is making serious progress! It was sent to the typesetter, who got it into the format in which it will be printed. The typesetter then sent it back and the entire New Testament was proofread by our two translators and two other Shekgalagari speakers.

The first proofreading stage was completed last week. Now the New Testament is back with the typesetter, and a second round of proofreading will begin next Monday. That will take around two weeks, and then it will be sent to the printer!

Kelsey spent part of June at a conference focused on distribution of the Bible and Bible-related materials. She spent four days learning a program called Scripture App Builder, followed by four days of networking, listening to presentations, and discussing ideas with people from all around the world.

Thank you for supporting our vehicle fund! We were able to purchase a truck with a covered bed, which is great for our family needs and for Bible distribution projects. We are thankful for your quick response to this need and that we were able to find a good vehicle quickly.

Big prayer request!

Our 5-year work and residency permits expire at the beginning of July. After months of preparing paperwork, we submitted our application for another 5 years. Please pray with us that we are granted new permits so that we can remain in Botswana!

Keep us in your prayers:

- For the second round of proofreading for the Shekgalagari New Testament
- For everything to go smoothly at the typesetter and printer so we can launch the New Testament as scheduled
- For the kids' school exams, that their anxieties would be stilled and their minds strong
- For health as we move into Botswana winter
- For the big transitions in our family that are coming up with MaryJane's schooling
- For unity and understanding among different translation and mission organizations around southern Africa
- That God would continue to provide for our ministry through partners like you.
